On 2 April, six boys from our New Life Project in Kanchanaburi ordinated as novices, along with 67 other boys, as part of the activities associated with the Summer Ordination Ceremony (honoring the birthday of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn on the same day). They will learn Buddhist teachings and practice meditation from 2-22 April at Wat Sapan Temple in Bangkok and the Sampanta Mediation Center at the New Life Project. Long-time DPF friend and supporter, Mr. Robert Wilson, also joined the ceremony and, coincidentally, it was his birthday too.









Youngsters Learn Basic Fire Safety

Fires are an ever-present danger in the crowded slum communities. So, to help minimize the chance of these occurring, the DPF volunteer fire-firefighters and their colleagues from other stations held a training session on basic fire safety during the school holidays. Fifty primary school-aged students took advantage of the opportunity on 1 April, and learned how to prevent fires in the home, how to protect themselves if a fire starts, and CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). Air Quality at Kindergarten

On 4 April, representatives from the Environmental Development Section of the Klong Toey District Office, and Dr. Pichai Sapparojpattana and his team from Charoenkrung Pracharak Hospital, came to donate a PM 2.5 Detector Air Quality Monitor, which will be installed in a room at the DPF Kindergarten. Dr. Pichai also instructed the teachers in its use and how to teach children to self-protect against PM 2.5.





Making Life a Little Easier

On 3 April, Khru Prateep went to the Lock 4-5-6 Community to donate a medical bed and a walking frame to a disabled man who suffers from severe weakness in his legs. He lives alone. Our volunteer fire-fighters helped to carry the equipment and also cleaned his house for him. Many thanks to the sponsor who donated this equipment through DPF to help the disabled people in need.





Scholarship Requirements

The first meetings for the parents/guardians of our sponsored students were held on 3, 4 and 5 April. Two further meetings, in other communities, will be held on 8 and 23 April. They were reminded of their obligations while their children receive financial support for their education, such as ensuring their child attends school, providing school results to our Sponsorship Section, writing letters of thanks (or drawings) on time, etc. In addition, Khru Prateep and our field workers updated the attendees on the progress of the coming eviction.





Road Safety 101

During the summer school holidays, the DPF Nithan caravan team has been busy around the communities, presenting shows on road safety for children. The team employs puppets, games and music to get their message across in a fun and enjoyable way. Children learn about basic road safety rules and the importance of wearing protective headgear when riding on motorcycles and bicycles. Parents and guardians are also participating in the activities. At the conclusion of the shows, safety helmets are presented to the children.

Officially welcomed by the project's staff and children, the Hands team were entertained by the lads with an exhibition of Thai Boxing to thank them for their generous support, after which the boys took them on a walking tour around the project. The 'Hands' riders saddled up again and completed their fundraising ride at Baan Than Namchai on 7 April.





Connecting the Generations



In the morning of 10 April, the DPF Sponsorship Section organized an activity "Young Children Visit the Elderly People" on the occasion of Thai New Year (Songkran). The group, led by Khru Prateep and staff, took 91 students (divided into nine groups) to visit and distribute Survival Bags to nine elderly and bed-ridden people in three communities – Lock 1-2-3, Lock 4-5-6 and 70-Rai communities. This activity is for the children to learn to help elderly people who are in difficult circumstances, and to share love and kindness towards them. The children can also learn to help their elderly family members in their own homes. Sponsors Lead Songkran Celebration

They also presented 30 wheelchairs to 15 community leaders and public health volunteers for patients in their communities. And in the afternoon, Khru Prateep and staff also brought the Survival gifts and adult diapers to the bed-ridden people. Thank you to all participants and all supporters of this special event.
